

Ocean Park Tai Shue Wan Pier - Rules and Regulations

In order to facilitate the safe use of the Ocean Park Tai Shue Wan Pier ("the Pier") and ensure its efficient management and operation, please comply with the following regulations:

1. The Pier opens from 9am to 7pm daily. This schedule may be adjusted without prior notice.
2. No vessel shall lie alongside the Pier for any purpose other than embarking or disembarking passengers (with their luggage, if any), and for any time longer than is reasonably necessary for such embarking or disembarking.
3. No vessel exceeding 21.64 metres in length shall go alongside the Pier.
4. No vessel shall make fast to any part of the Pier except to the recognized mooring bollards and rings provided thereon as moorings.
5. Please do not dive or jump into, or swim or bathe in the sea from the Pier unless otherwise approved.
6. Please do not engage in activities which involve hawking, loitering, or the erection/ installation/ placement/ distribution/ display of unauthorized items.
7. Please do not ride bicycles, tricycles, scooters or other vehicles with wheels (except for wheelchairs, strollers, or those otherwise approved), or engage in roller skating, in-line skating, skateboarding, or similar activities.
8. Please do not fish or feed birds or any wild animal.
9. Please do not smoke, litter or engage in horseplay.
10. Beware of the moving gangway while boarding or alighting.
11. Please keep clear of ship sides, mooring bollards and ropes while mooring operations are in progress.
12. Ocean Park may, from time to time and without prior notice and compensation, restrict the number of persons having access to or close the Pier due to the capacity limit of the Pier, inclement weather or other circumstances so required to ensure its safety, security, order or efficient management and operation.
13. For safety reasons, if the Hong Kong Observatory announces a specific hoisting time for Tropical Cyclone Signal No.1 during the operating hours of the Pier, the Pier will be closed two hours after the signal is hoisted and will delay opening for 48 hours after it is cancelled.
14. Ocean Park reserves the right to deny entry to a person or require them to leave the Pier, without any compensation, for failure to comply with any of the above rules; for unsafe, unlawful or disorderly conduct or posing dangers or nuisances to other users; to ensure the Pier's safety, security, order or efficient management and operation; or if other circumstances so require.
15. Ocean Park is not responsible and does not assume any liability for any damage to or loss of the property or belongings of any users of the Pier.
